










































HOW WE MADE OUR FIRST CASH AND OTHER RANDOM DEVELOPMENTS

Then if you wait long enough, you will receive a mail.







This thing got us. A fan (remember Kurolayefah Owugah? We received an extensive fan mail from him which was published in our last issue) did a review of our issues 5 (prologue inclusive) and sent it in to CR. We at team Avonome™ were blown literarily. These are the kind of mindsets we appreciate – an unbiased approach to a new and alien material. Without further ado, here's your chance to read his thoughts. Dig in.

REVIEW:

A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE AVONOVERSE: WHY ISSUE 5 PROLOGUE AND 5 IS A MAJOR GAME CHANGER.

I recently picked up comic republic's two in one edition "Avonome" issue 5 prologue and Issue 5. I'm not one for doing reviews but this issue piqued my sordid interest in doing one...in between I had to struggle with setting aside time to draft this objective piece. I am not going to reveal much and will stay right on track with few spoilers just enough for those who haven't read it to go and pick up a copy here as well as anticipate 6.

Alright, let's get down to some in depth review. When it comes to visual story telling of indie publishers in Nigeria, our major lean to in this aspect has always been tapping into the mythical ethos of the ancestral world, gathering symbolic elements that guide the reader through significant markers of ancient culture that reflect societal beliefs. Avonome rests heavily upon these elements and draws deeply from it.

Issue 5 prologue & 5 picks up from where issue 3 & 4 left off, pretty much in a clandestine manner. We not only get to see Avonome on a brink of life and death but we also get a glimpse of things through



character perspective. We journey at first narrative into the character's life through her guardian angel Azrael who shares insight of his first meeting with the character and what he sees in her. I like the way this is handled pretty deeply (the point of views are pretty reminiscent of #4 though it pretty much has a different feel because of the angles even though we get the vibe that we've seen this before). We journey through the realms into the physical world with Ajobara (remember him? the fellow responsible for putting Avonome in a life and death situation in #3) our journey with Ajobara leads us to a meeting and introduction of a certain new mysterious character that is much more powerful than Ajobara or so it seems...

To top it all off this menacing new character seems to have stronger ties to Avonome's past. Godlike immortal in nature...the mystery deepens tugging on one's psyche to learn more. It gets even deeper when we are teased of a new villlian's awakening. This is revealed to Avonome in her sojourn with the realm within... When I initially started reading Avonome I always felt this realm within sub title was a subtle reference to the spirit realm or some realm we were going to be treated to sometime later on but this issue firmly establishes the core center that gravitates towards this reference.

The realm within is none other than the mysterious realm from which Avonome draws her powers from (but then again I might still be wrong considering you know... (Go figure)...Writer's twist but I firmly believe so). We finally move over to the gathering of the Kiriji and the rest of the gods who are also aware and somehow dread the arrival of this new villain.

Then we phase back to Avonome's world as yet another mysterious figure bearing an interesting title (of which I'm going to lay reference to later) appears just in time to save Avonome from a horde of carnivorous beast creatures or rather monsters. Then we are left longing for more just to

wrap things up. A couple of haunting questions lingers at the end though to hunt your psyche...an interesting creative buildup of a character name such as "Black Ghandi" provokes hints of a revolution coming our way and to top it all up the Hogosha title (which is an adopted Japanese term) attached to his persona which is hinted in a quote at the beginning pages of the book brilliantly significantly translates to guardian, patron or protector. So that's pretty much it, wait you're expecting more, heesh! even I too but I wouldn't want to spoil so much...

A lot of wonderful content not mentioned could quench your thirst. I know it left me pretty much satisfied. Once again go pick it up here www.thecomicrepublic.com you can only dive too deep.

In conclusion to this brief overview here are the critique points and why issue 5.5&5 is a major game changer in the avonoverse.

[5 stars] Well-established plot and excellent pacing.

[4 stars] Great dialogue

[5 stars] established villain (hey! at least now we've got a major bad guy to look out for)
[5stars] Spectacular art especially colors suggestive of mood and established tone.
[3.5 stars] satisfying read.

These are our strong points. Now we move onto weak points.

Aaaargh! I hate to point out there are none (personal opinion though). Do inbox me if you noticed any. I terribly enjoyed this issue and constantly snuck in for several readings and each time I discovered something new. Only one nitpick I have to point out though; the release: Issue 5 prologue was released first before the mash up. And I picked that up too. So going through 5 prologue and 5 and realizing I had read most of the beginning wasn't much of a pleasant surprise...



it only made what was left undiscovered a bit pretty small in content. Can't wait to see what's coming next in 6 and 7 though (that's if CR keeps up with the mash up trend).

A word of commendation and fiery motivation to push forth, goes forth to the entire Comic Republic team (yes I do believe everyone needs commendation nowadays on an equal note) especially those who handled the art direction, colors and story for working out the magic to make this piece.




